CIVIL WAR

PVT. FREDERICK A. BREWER

Company L, 4th Michigan Cavalry

Enlisted August 1, 1862 at age 27, Listed as Prisoner of War in November 1864, died of disease at Jefferson Barracks Missouri, June 17, 1865. He is interred at Maplewood Cemetery, Hopkins Township.

PVT. DARWIN E. CALLOWAY

Company I, 5th Michigan Cavalry

Enlisted on August 22, 1862 at age 30, Taken Prisoner at James City, Virginia, October 11, 1863. No further record.

PVT. WILLIAM EVERHART

Company D, Michigan Engineers and Mechanics, Enlisted on August 19th, 1864 at age 29, as an Artificer (a skilled or artistic worker or craftsman). Died of disease at Nashville, Tennessee on March 28, 1863. He is interred in Nashville National Cemetery, Tennessee.

PVT. REUBEN GROMMON

Company B, 4th Michigan Cavalry

Enlisted on January 15, 1864 at age 20, died of disease at Gallatin, Tennessee on February 21, 1865. He is interred in Nashville National Cemetery, Tennessee.

PVT. REUBEN HOFFMASTER

Unassigned, 13th Michigan Infantry, Enlisted on February, 8, 1865 at age 19, died of disease on February, 19, 1865 at Jackson, Michigan. He is interred at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Cemetery, Hopkins Township.

PVT. HOMER MANKIN

Company G, 6th Michigan Infantry, Enlisted on March 30, 1864 at age 18, died of disease at Vicksburg, Mississippi on July 12, 1864. He is interred at Vicksburg National Cemetery, Mississippi.

CORP. CHARLES PARSONS

Company D, 17th Michigan Infantry, Enlisted on July 31, 1862 at age 23, died of disease at Lebanon, Kentucky on April 25, 1863. He is interred at Lebanon National Cemetery, Kentucky.

PVT. JOSEPH REUL ROUND

Company H, 4th Vermont Volunteer Infantry, Enlisted on August 27, 1863, wounded at the battle of the Wilderness, taken Prisoner of War, confined first at Libby Prison then Andersonville Prison, later at Millen Georgia, died in prison.

PVT. CHARLES F. SMITH

Company L, 4th Michigan Cavalry, Enlisted on August 9th, 1862 at age 26, died at Nashville, Tennessee on February 1, 1863. He is interred at Nashville National Cemetery, Tennessee.

PVT. BENJAMIN WARD

Company D, 17th Michigan Infantry, Enlisted July 25, 1862 at age 21, killed in action at South Mountain, Maryland on August 14, 1862. He is interred at Antietam National Cemetery, Maryland.

INDIAN WARS

PVT. CHARLES ANWAY

United States 7th Cavalry, Troop B, Enlisted on April 29, 1890, survived the battle at Wounded Knee, South Dakota on January 11, 1891, furloughed from Fort Riley, Kansas to Chicago, Illinois. Died there on December 25, 1892. He is interred at Fort Sheridan, Chicago, Illinois.

SGT. HARRY B. STONE

United States 7th Cavalry, Troop B, Enlisted on April 29, 1890, died of wounds from the battle at Wounded Knee on January 11, 1891. He is interred Pine Ridge Agency Post Cemetery, Kansas.

WORLD WAR I

CPL. FRANK PACKER

126th Infantry Regiment, 32nd Division, died August 27, 1918. He is interred Oise-Aisne American Cemetery, Fere-en-Tardenois, France
